Dear Parent/Carer

There is a new system for bringing your child to Nursery and to go home:

- Parents will not come inside the Nursery building.
- Parents will come through the open garden gate when they come to Nursery.
- There is a one-way system to come through the garden to bring your child to the way inside. A member of staff will meet you there. You must keep your child safe until they go inside the building.
- Make sure that you bring a raincoat, welly-boots and a bag of clothes for your child. These must be labelled with your child's name. Do not bring any toys to Nursery. Do not bring hand-sanitiser for your child: it is not safe. Washing hands with soap is best.
- When your child has come inside we will make sure they wash hands before they join their group.
- Please follow the one-way signs to leave the garden, and allow space for other families.
- When you come to collect your child please wait in the garden, or on the pavement outside if no room in the garden. Do not block the gate because people need to come out safely. We will send children outside to parents, one by one. Follow the one-way system.
- If you would like to talk to your child's key person, please phone the office to arrange a suitable time.
- **Do NOT come to Nursery if you, or anyone that you have contact with, has symptoms of the virus (fever, cough, fatigue, loss of sense of taste and/or smell, vomiting, diarrhoea). Follow government guidelines.**

We have put in additional hygiene measures to help reduce spread the virus:

- There is a new system to wash all toys regularly.
- Children will have more support and teaching for better hygiene, washing hands and using tissues safely.
- High risk resources (playdough, soft toys) have been removed.

Please remember:

- It is very important that you follow current government guidelines to reduce spread in the community outside school.
